The First World War: Reshaping the Modern World	Skills USII, USII.4, Skills CE, CE.9m, Skills WG, WG.1, WG.5, WG.14, WG.17, Skills WHII, WHII.8, Skills VUS, VUS.11	Students will explore the changes in modern warfare exemplified in the trenches of World War I and how the conflict shifted the international balance of power and the United States' place on the global stage.
Hampton Roads in World War II: A Wartime Community	Skills USII, USII.6, Skills CE, Skills WG, WG.2, WG.13, WG.15, WG.16, Skills WHI, Skills WHII, WHII.9, Skills VUS, VUS.14, Skills GOVT	Using Newport News and the Hampton Roads area as the primary case study, students will examine the ways that civilians contributed to and experienced World War II from the home front and how wartime industrial activity changed communities and landscapes.

Military Matters of World War II	Skills WHI, Skills WHII, WHII.9, Skills VUS, VUS.14, Skills GOVT	<p>In this program, students will dive deep into the key military moments and technologies of World War II across the global theaters of war to identify major battles and differences between Axis and Allied leadership and strategy.</p>
Life During the Holocaust	Skills USII, USII.6, Skills CE, Skills WG, WG.1, WG.5, WG.13, WG.14, Skills WHI, Skills WHII, WHII.2, WHII.9, Skills VUS, VUS.14, Skills GOVT	<p>Through examination of eyewitness accounts, students will examine the gradual progression through which the Holocaust came about and how individuals experienced and reacted to the changes happening around them.</p>
Propaganda: Crafting Unity	Skills USII, USII.4, USII.6, Skills CE, CE.8, CE.9, Skills WG	<p>Students will work to define and identify what propaganda is and both the linguistic and artistic techniques used to craft it by examining a collection of wartime propaganda posters, in the process, learning to identify bias and thinking more critically about historical sources.</p>
